Situated along the serene banks of the **Sombhadra River** in Haroli tehsil, Una district, Himachal Pradesh, **Professor Simmi Agnihotri Government Degree College, Haroli**, is a transformative institution dedicated to empowering rural youth, particularly girls. Established in 2017 through a government notification dated 4th May 2017, the college was founded to make higher education accessible to girls in a backward rural area. Renamed in 2024 in honor of **Professor Simmi Agnihotri** (notification dated 12th March 2024), it reflects a legacy of academic excellence and social impact. Serving **25–30 villages** in the agriculturally dominated Haroli tehsil, the college addresses educational disparities, fosters holistic development, and prepares students for professional and personal success.

The allocation of funds for a **girls' hostel** under the **PM Ujjwala Scheme for Higher Education (PM USHA)** is a pivotal step to enhance the college's capacity to serve its community. This justification outlines why the hostel is essential, emphasizing its role in supporting the college's new professional (**BBA, BCA**) and postgraduate (**M.A., M.Com**) courses, addressing the needs of a predominantly female student body, and advancing national goals of inclusivity and skill development. By providing a safe and accessible residential facility, the hostel will empower girls from remote areas, boost the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER), and catalyze socio-economic progress in Haroli.

Geographical and Demographic Context

Himachal Pradesh: A Rural Himalayan State

Himachal Pradesh, spanning **55,673 square kilometers**, is a northern Indian state known for its Himalayan landscapes and cultural heritage. With a population of **6,864,602** (2011 Census), projected to reach approximately **7,781,244** by 2021, the state is predominantly rural, with **89.97%** of residents living in villages. Its low population density (**123 persons per square kilometer**) reflects vast, sparsely populated terrains. The state's literacy rate of **82.80%** (male: 89.53%, female: 75.93%) surpasses national averages, driven by initiatives like the "Schooling Revolution" (1961–2001), which achieved near-universal primary enrollment. However, rural areas face challenges such as geographical isolation, limited infrastructure, and economic dependence on agriculture, which employs about half the workforce. The sex ratio of **972 females per 1,000 males** indicates a balanced demographic, but gender disparities in higher education persist in remote regions.

Una District: A Lowland Educational Hub

Una district, covering **1,540 square kilometers**, is a lowland region in southwestern Himachal Pradesh, serving as a gateway to Punjab's plains. With a population of **521,173** (2011 Census)



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nd a density of 338 persons per square kilometer, Una is more densely populated than the state average. Its literacy rate of 86.53% (male: 92.12%, female: 81.11%) ranks second among Himachal's districts, reflecting strong educational progress. The district's rural population (91.38%) relies heavily on agriculture, and its sex ratio (976 females per 1,000 males) mirrors the state's gender balance. Una's five tehsils, including Haroli, are characterized by fertile plains and a significant presence of Other Backward Classes (OBCs) and Scheduled Castes (SCs), who face socio-economic challenges despite high literacy.

Haroli Tehsil: A Backward Rural Landscape

Haroli tehsil, part of Una district, is a quintessential rural area with fertile agricultural lands and small, tightly knit villages. Serving 25–30 villages, the college caters to a population likely numbering in the tens of thousands, with a demographic profile similar to Una's rural areas (literacy: 86.65%, female literacy: 83.06%). The tehsil's residents, predominantly OBCs and SCs, depend on agriculture, with limited access to non-agricultural employment. Haroli is classified as a **backward rural area** due to:

- **Economic Constraints:** Small landholdings and monsoon-dependent farming limit income, leading to out-migration.
- **Social Barriers:** Traditional gender norms, such as early marriage, hinder girls' access to higher education.
- **Educational Gaps:** While primary education is robust, professional and postgraduate opportunities are scarce, necessitating institutions like the college.

However, despite the above disadvantages, this constituency stands tall in **road connectivity** and transportation. It boasts of a well developed network of roads, connecting the rural areas with the district. Also, being in the vicinity of the Punjab border, it facilitates cross border commutation. This inter connectivity will make hostel facilities accessible for both intra- and inter-state. Thereby, giving an impetus to this constituency, emerging as an academic hub in the coming future.

The college addresses these challenges by providing local access to higher education, reducing the need for students, especially girls, to migrate to cities like Una, Chandigarh, or Shimla.



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The College: A Pillar of Rural Education

Establishment and Purpose

Inaugurated in 2017, Professor Simmi Agnihotri Government Degree College, Haroli, was established to democratize higher education for rural girls in a region where such opportunities were limited. Its renaming in 2024 honors Professor Simmi Agnihotri's contributions to education and underscores its commitment to academic excellence and social impact. Strategically located in Haroli, the college serves as an educational hub for **25–30 villages**, catering to a diverse student body, with a focus on marginalized communities. The college has 26 kanals of land (9991 sq. mt.) in its possession.

Mission and Vision

The college's **mission** is to develop a state-of-the-art institution in an agriculture-dominated area, integrating technology and academics to foster holistic progression, with a special emphasis on girls' education and empowerment. Its **vision** is to build an institution of excellence that imbues students with knowledge, skills, and ethical values, preparing them for meaningful personal lives, professional success, and social responsibility. These goals align with India's **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, which emphasizes inclusivity, skill development, and holistic education.

Academic Offerings

The college initially offered undergraduate courses in **Humanities** (e.g., English, Hindi, Political Science, History) and **Commerce**, providing foundational education to rural students. To meet evolving educational and economic demands, it introduced **professional courses** under the Self-Finance Scheme, effective from the **2025–26 academic session**, managed by the **Higher Education Institute Society (HIES)** of the college.

- **Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA):** Equips students with management, entrepreneurship, and leadership skills, enabling them to contribute to rural economies or pursue corporate careers.
- **Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA):** Prepares students for IT and technology-driven roles, aligning with India's digital economy and offering remote work opportunities.

Additionally, **postgraduate courses** were introduced in the 2025–26 session to enhance higher education access:

- **M.A. English, Hindi, Political Science, History:** These programs deepen academic expertise, preparing students for careers in teaching, research, public administration,


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- **M.Com:** Focuses on advanced commerce and finance skills, supporting career growth in banking, accounting, and business management.

These courses reflect the college's commitment to diversifying educational offerings, ensuring relevance to local needs (e.g., agriculture, education) and global opportunities (e.g., IT, management). By introducing professional and postgraduate programs, the college addresses the educational aspirations of rural youth, particularly girls, who previously had to migrate for such opportunities.

Pedagogical Excellence

The college adheres to the **Academic Calendar** issued by Himachal Pradesh University, ensuring structured and timely curriculum delivery. Classes are conducted with decorum, emphasizing innovative and creative teaching methods. A dedicated faculty, driven by a passion for education, focuses on:

- **Holistic Learning:** Integrating cognitive, analytical, and practical skills to foster critical thinking.
- **Teamwork:** Encouraging collaborative projects to build interpersonal and leadership skills.
- **Competitive Spirit:** Promoting academic excellence and a sense of achievement through competitions and assessments.

The curriculum aligns with HP University guidelines, ensuring quality and consistency. A well-equipped **library**, stocked with books, journals, and digital resources, serves as a knowledge hub, supporting research and intellectual growth. Faculty members employ modern pedagogical tools, such as project-based learning and digital aids, to enhance student engagement.

Extracurricular and Holistic Development

Beyond academics, the college nurtures well-rounded individuals through a range of platforms:

- **National Service Scheme (NSS):** Engages students in community service, fostering social responsibility and civic awareness.
- **Rovers and Rangers (R&R):** Promotes leadership, teamwork, and outdoor activities, building resilience and confidence.
- **Road Safety Club:** Raises awareness about traffic rules and safety, addressing local needs in a rural area with increasing vehicular traffic.



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- **Cultural and other Clubs:** Provide opportunities for creative expression.

These initiatives hone students' potential, build soft skills, and prepare them for diverse challenges. A **ragging-free environment**, monitored by a dedicated anti-ragging committee, ensures a safe and inclusive campus, particularly for girls, fostering a sense of security and belonging.

Student Demographics

The college's student body reflects its rural context and commitment to inclusivity. With a 80:20 girl-to-boy ratio, it prioritizes female education, addressing gender disparities in higher education. Approximately 60–70% of students belong to **OBC categories**, with significant representation from Scheduled Castes, highlighting the college's role in serving marginalized communities. This demographic composition aligns with national inclusivity goals, such as those outlined in NEP 2020 and PM USHA.

Justification for the Girls' Hostel

The allocation of funds for a girls' hostel under the **PM USHA Scheme** is a critical investment in the college's mission to empower rural girls and enhance higher education access in Haroli. The hostel addresses pressing challenges, supports the college's expanded academic offerings, and aligns with national priorities of gender equity, inclusivity, and skill development. Below are the key reasons why the hostel is essential:

Addressing Accessibility Barriers

Haroli's 25–30 villages, spread across a rural landscape, present significant geographical challenges. Students, particularly girls, face long commutes (10–20 kilometers), with monsoons and winters exacerbating accessibility issues, deterring regular attendance. The hostel will:

- **Eliminate Travel Barriers:** Provide residential facilities for students from remote villages, ensuring consistent attendance and reducing dropout rates.
- **Expand Reach:** Enable the college to serve students from other parts of Una district or Himachal Pradesh, broadening its impact beyond Haroli.

This accessibility is crucial for the new **BBA, BCA, and postgraduate courses**, which require sustained engagement over multiple years.

Supporting Economic Constraints

Haroli's economy is dominated by subsistence agriculture, with families often unable to afford travel or accommodation costs for urban education. For girls, these economic barriers are compounded by societal expectations to prioritize domestic responsibilities. The hostel will:

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- **Reduce Financial Burden:** Eliminate commuting costs and the need for urban lodging, making higher education affordable for low-income families.
- **Enable Focus on Studies:** Allow students to dedicate time to academics and extracurricular activities, rather than balancing travel and household duties.

By addressing economic constraints, the hostel ensures that financial limitations do not hinder girls' access to professional and postgraduate education.

Ensuring Safety and Security

Safety is a paramount concern for parents in rural areas, who are often reluctant to send girls to distant institutions without secure lodging. The lack of safe residential options has historically limited female enrollment in higher education. The hostel will provide a **Secure Environment and foster a Supportive Community**. This secure environment is particularly critical for girls pursuing BBA, BCA, and M.A./M.Com programs, which may require evening study sessions or extended campus engagement.

Boosting Enrollment and GER (Gross Enrollment Ratio)

The introduction of **BBA, BCA, and postgraduate courses** in 2025–26 has increased demand for enrollment, particularly among girls, who constitute **70%** of the student body. However, the lack of residential facilities limits the college's capacity to accommodate students from beyond Haroli. The hostel will:

- **Increase Enrollment:** Enable the college to absorb students from remote areas, boosting GER in a backward region where higher education access is limited.
- **Support New Programs:** Provide residential support for students in professional and postgraduate courses, which require longer study durations and specialized resources.

Himachal Pradesh's GER (33.2% in 2020) is above the national average (27.1%), but rural areas like Haroli lag. The hostel will contribute to India's target of 50% GER by 2035 by ensuring more girls can pursue higher education.

Promoting Inclusivity for Marginalized Communities

With **60–70%** of students belonging to **OBC categories** and significant SC representation, the college serves marginalized communities disproportionately affected by educational and economic disparities. The hostel will:


- **Prioritize Marginalized Students:** Reserve spaces for OBC and SC girls, aligning with PM USHA's equity objectives.
- **Address Social Barriers:** Provide a supportive environment to overcome socio-cultural challenges, such as early marriage, which disproportionately affect marginalized groups.

This focus on inclusivity ensures that the hostel benefits the most underserved segments of Haroli's population.

Enhancing Academic and Holistic Outcomes

A residential facility will enhance students' academic and personal development by:

- **Facilitating Focused Learning:** Allow students to access the college's library, study groups, and faculty support, improving academic performance.
- **Encouraging Extracurricular Engagement:** Enable participation in NSS, R&R, and cultural clubs, fostering leadership, teamwork, and soft skills.
- **Promoting Peer Learning:** Create a collaborative environment where students can share knowledge and experiences, enhancing critical thinking.

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These outcomes are particularly significant for BBA and BCA students, who require practical skills and industry exposure, and M.A./M.Com students, who benefit from research and mentorship.

Catalyzing Socio-Economic Development

Educated women are key drivers of socio-economic progress. Studies show that a 1% increase in female education can boost GDP growth by 0.3%. The hostel will:

- **Empower Girls:** Enable more girls to complete higher education, delaying marriage, improving family health, and increasing workforce participation.
- **Foster Local Leadership:** Prepare graduates to contribute to Haroli's development through teaching, entrepreneurship, or community initiatives.
- **Reduce Out-Migration:** Equip students with skills for local or remote jobs (e.g., IT roles via BCA), reducing dependence on urban migration.

By empowering girls from 25–30 villages, the hostel will create a ripple effect, uplifting the region's socio-economic fabric.

Aligning with National Priorities

The hostel aligns with national policies, including:

- **NEP 2020:** Supports inclusivity, skill development (via BBA, BCA), and infrastructure enhancement in rural areas.
- **PM USHA:** Advances gender equity and access to higher education in underserved regions.
- **Skill India Mission:** Prepares students for high-demand careers in management and IT, contributing to India's digital economy.

This alignment ensures that the hostel is a strategic investment in India's educational and economic goals. The hostel's location on or near the campus will minimize commuting time, allowing students to fully engage in academic and extracurricular activities.

Financial Rationale

The PM USHA Scheme prioritizes infrastructure development in backward areas to promote gender equity and inclusivity. The hostel's funding is justified by:


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- **High Female Enrollment:** With 70% of students being girls, the hostel addresses the needs of the majority demographic.
- **Rural Backwardness:** Haroli's socio-economic challenges necessitate residential facilities to bridge educational gaps.
- **New Academic Programs:** Increased enrollment in BBA, BCA, and postgraduate courses requires infrastructure to support students from remote areas.
- **Social Equity:** Prioritizing OBC and SC students aligns with PM USHA's focus on marginalized communities.
- **Long-Term Impact:** A one-time investment in hostel infrastructure will yield sustained benefits, reducing recurring costs for travel or urban migration.

The girls' hostel at Professor Simmi Agnihotri Government Degree College, Haroli, is a vital investment in the future of rural Himachal Pradesh. Serving **25–30 villages** in a backward area, the college empowers girls through its **BBA, BCA, and postgraduate programs**, addressing educational disparities and fostering holistic development. The hostel is essential to overcome geographical, economic, and social barriers, ensuring that girls from remote areas can access higher education in a safe and supportive environment. By boosting enrollment, promoting inclusivity, and catalyzing socio-economic progress, the hostel aligns with national priorities like NEP 2020 and PM USHA. With a **80:20 girl-to-boy ratio** and a majority OBC student body, the college is a model of equity and excellence, and the hostel will amplify its impact, transforming Haroli into a hub of empowered, educated women who shape a brighter future for their communities.







TERMS & CONDITIONS

The above work can be taken up by the BSNL as a deposit work as per CPWD Works manual and procedure, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Full estimated cost of the work as worked out by BSNL including departmental charges will have to be deposited by the Client deptt. before the work is taken up for execution. All the statutory taxes shall be borne by the Client deptt.
2. BSNL may at its discretion allow the clients to deposit the funds in installment. In such cases 33-1/3% of the estimated cost should be deposited as advance. Thereafter, expenditure incurred should be reimbursed in full through monthly bills. The initial deposit of 33-1/3% would be retained for adjustment against the last portion of the estimated expenditure. No interest will be paid by BSNL to the client department for such deposits.
3. The Client department should hand over vacant possession of land/site to BSNL. BSNL may, if so required, take responsibility for demolition/disposal of existing building/structures.
4. BSNL does not bind itself to complete the work within the estimated cost. If additional funds are required, the same will have to be provided by the client deptt. Necessary revised estimate will be submitted as and when required if the cost exceeds beyond 10% of the sanctioned amount.
5. Any dispute arising out of the operation of the contract(s) for the subject work will be subject to arbitration as provided for in the contract agreement. BSNL will defend the arbitration proceedings as best as it can and get the Arbitration's award examined by the appropriate authority. The decision of the competent authority in BSNL to accept the award to challenge the same in a Court of Law will be binding on the client department. All legal charges to defend the Arbitration proceedings/ Court cases shall be borne by the client department.
6. Funds for making payment of all amounts which may be decreed by a Court of Law, Tribunal or by award of an Arbitrator in relation to the deposit work will be made available by the client department promptly irrespective of it not being a party before the Court, Tribunal or Arbitrator. Such payments will be in addition to the payments made to the contractors for executions of work.
7. After receipt of A/A & E/S from the client department, the BSNL will submit various detailed Architectural drawings and services plans to client deptt. for submission to the local

governing Bodies whose approvals are required before taking up the construction work. These Local bodies are independent organizations and BSNL has no control over them. These Local bodies take their own time for approving the plans. The time required to get such approvals is not included in the construction time as indicated in the estimate. Although BSNL will assist to get such approvals early, it may be necessary for the client department to pursue with Local Bodies for early approval.

8. The BSNL has no funds of its own for investing in the work. The client department should, therefore, ensure that adequate funds are available with BSNL for executing the work. In case the client department fails to provide funds as per requirements, it may be necessary for BSNL to suspend/abandon the work. In such eventuality, the client department shall be solely responsible for all the consequences arising out of such stoppage/abandonment of work including claims of contractors for compensation/damages.
9. The client department will help BSNL in-
 - (a) Providing site for labour huts for the contractor's labour free of cost.






